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**01. CALL TO ORDER:**

**7:45 PM** – Committee member Mark Mauceri, acting as Chair in Hyams absence, called the meeting to order.

**02. PUBLIC COMMENTS ON NON-AGENDA ITEMS**

**7:45 PM** – Frank Masi:

1. He believes we have to come up with some way to have board members talk to each other in some sort of properly noticed but semi-informal way.
2. Has told people he was interested in the VP, Administration position. He feels he'd like to have a seat on the EC. He has since realized the VP, Administration also chairs R&E, which he wouldn't have time to do given his current commitment to the PZHP committee. However, as recently realized, he can have input on R&E issues. So no longer feels the need to put his name forward for VP, Administration when it comes up for election after the new Board Members are seated.

**03. REVIEW AND INCORPORATION OF THE GOVERNING BOARD'S PREVIOUSLY APPROVED MOTIONS INTO THE "STANDING RULES, POLICIES AND PROCEDURES" (SRPP) DOCUMENT.**

**7:55 PM** –

Mauceri: Asks this item be moved to a later time in the agenda as the actual SRPP document was not included in the meeting handouts (although it was processed, it went missing) and suggests the one item the committee can act upon now is to list the committees as they currently appear on the website in the Standing Rules document, and if time allows, to review recent motions adopted by the Board to ensure they are "memorialized" into the SRPP; calls for a motion.

**MOTION:** De Ocampo (for the purpose of discussion).

**SECOND:** DeMonte

DISCUSSION:

Mauceri explains the committee is continually codifying the SRPP document and a list of GGPNC Committees as they currently stand would be the council's basis of reference going forward.

DeMonte: Observes "Outreach" is currently listed as "Communications & Outreach." Mauceri clarifies that is the official title as specified in the Bylaws, which further illustrates why this motion should be entertained.

**MOTION:** (De Ocampo): That committees be listed in SRPP document as currently listed on the GGPNC website.

**SECOND:** DeMonte.

**PASSED:** By consensus.

**MOTION:** (De Ocampo): To table the rest of agenda item #3 (previously adopted Board motions) to a later time (possibly the end of meeting.)

**SECOND:** DeMonte.

**PASSED:** By consensus.

**4. APPOINTMENT PROCEDURES FOR MAY 17 GOVERNING BOARD APPOINTMENTS;  
DISCUSSION AND ACTION AS APPROPRIATE.**

**8:30 PM –**

[Agenda Item taken out of order]

Mauceri: These procedures follow the last appointment process in two respects:

1. Tabulation of vote numbers only.
2. Announcing who voted for whom only once a winner is announced (See attachment 'A'):  
"Procedures for selection of Appointed Board Members – May 2011."

Mauceri polls room to see if committee members have previously reviewed the document...

Suggests the committee treat this as a work session and suspend Parliamentary procedure so the group can read through the document, ask questions and make notes regarding passages where there are concerns or comments for potential formal amendments in a second "pass;" calling for a motion to proceed as described.

**MOTION:** De Ocampo.

**SECOND:** DeMonte.

**PASSED:** By consensus.

Mauceri walks the committee through the agenda supplement document (committee member and/or public comment and questions okay):

**APPOINTMENT PROCEDURES DOCUMENT ITEM LIST REVIEW:**

II, A. Mauceri explains this item is to conform to the form of application form already circulated.

II, B. Self-explanatory.

III, A. This is to make sure that there are no mistakes on the pre-prepared ballots during the appointment voting process.

Ostrow: Thinks the requirement is fine but states the candidates are already in compliance with the bylaws when they sent their applications.

III, B. This is to limit the amount of written material any one supporter or “opposer” can submit to a reasonable level for Board review when considering the number of candidates.

III, C. Self-explanatory.

III, D. Self-explanatory.

III, E. Already approved by GGPNC Board.

III, F-1. Is a fairness measure to assure random order within all appointment categories.

III, F-2.

Ostrow: Asks for clarification on limiting public comment.

De Monte: Thinks it should be general questions only.

Mauceri: Let’s keep that in mind when we come back for a “second pass.”

III, F-3. Self-explanatory.

III, F-4. Ferris: Suggests inserting the word “optional” in the title of this section so candidates know this not a requirement.

III, F-5. This passage is near verbatim from last appointment procedures.

III, F-6. This is almost like the last time but differs in that Board members who are also candidates for this process will not be able to ask questions or make comments regarding other candidates.

III, G. “Voting:” Mauceri goes through proposed procedures.

Ostrow: Noting should the committee approve the document as written, we’ll need to give very clear instructions to Tellers on tabulation.

III, H. This gives the Board latitude if a particular seat should not be filled due to candidates dropping out, not receiving any votes, etc., it would be the option of the Board to fill that seat with a nomination from the floor (or not).

Mauceri calls for public comment. Hyams arrives (8:30 pm).

Ron Ostrow: According the C, 2 we need to add the words “details specific to the vote.”

**MOTION:** Hyams so moves.

**SECOND:** De Ocampo.

**PASSED:** By consensus.

Mauceri opens floor to committee for motions to amend document as reviewed.

**MOTION:** DeMonte: (III, F-2: Public comment/questions to candidates) moves we enter discussion on this procedure.

**SECOND:** Hyams.

DeMonte: Has a concern allowing comments would open the door for potential abuse. Would prefer general questions only.

Mauceri: Clarifying public comments or from Board Members?

DeMonte: It’s better not to open it to opposition. It prompts people to say hurtful things.

Hyams: Feels this is a free speech issue.

Ferris: Will the Tellers make the call on which person gets to ask/comment if there are more than three?

Mauceri: Yes. However, the Tellers will ostensibly be chosen for their impartiality; they will have

latitude, but matching submitters to pre-disposed positions not likely.

**MOTION:** (Hyams): to strike III, F-2 altogether.

**SECOND:** DeMonte

**OBJECTION:** Mauceri

**VOTE:** For 1 (Hyams), Opposed 3: (DeMonte, De Ocampo, Mauceri).

**MOTION FAILS.**

Hyams: This isn't about the public asking questions of a candidate. It should be the Board asking the questions. Doesn't see any need to do this.

DeMonte: Suggests formatted for/against cards for public comment.

De Ocampo: Prefers some kind of compromise so we can stay with precedent and have still public input.

**MOTION:** (De Ocampo): to amend III, F-2 to remove "opposing and supporting statements" and only allow for stakeholder general questions directed to all candidates, but limited to two comments per appointed position contemplated.

**SECOND:** DeMonte

**PASSED:** By consensus.

**MOTION:** (Hyams) (re: III, B. Advocacy Statements): add the word "optional" to III. B and wherever appears in later passages.

**SECOND:** DeMonte.

**PASSED:** By consensus.

**MOTION** (Hyams): To enter discussion on whether or not Board members participating as candidates, regardless of position sought, can ask questions of other candidates at any time during the process.

**SECOND:** Mauceri (for purpose of discussion).

#### DISCUSSION:

Mauceri: Understands the sentiment but can't prevent board members from being able to pose questions to candidates.

Hyams: Holds we can't restrict in this way without changing bylaws.

No further motions result from discussion.

**MOTION:** (Hyams): To accept document as amended.

**SECOND:** De Ocampo

**OBJECTION:** Mauceri

**MOTION** (Mauceri): Moves to enter into discussion on III, F-4, before potentially adopting the document.

**SECOND:** Hyams (for purpose of discussion)

Mauceri: Suggests insertion of "Optional" in first sentence. Also, suggests III, F-5. question and answer period refinement.

Ostrow: (Re: III, F-5): His preference would be to tell board members if they don't have a question to "pass" in order to keep process moving.

**MOTION:** (Mauceri): Remove the word “first” from III, F-5 and add “optional” as discussed.

**SECOND:** Hyams.

**PASSED:** By consensus.

Mauceri passes gavel to Hyams to actively participate in discussion, reviews changes from original draft now approved and recommends committee adoption of the amended procedure to ensure the council’s ‘last’ appointment process en masse runs as efficiently as possible and to recognize the time constraints involved with the meeting starting at 7:00 PM.

Hyams returns the gavel to Mauceri who calls for a motion.

**MOTION:** (DeMonte): Approve document as amended.

**SECOND:** Hyams

**PASSED:** By consensus.

COMMENTS:

DeMonte: Notes recusal from this process by Mauceri might have been appropriate since he is running for an appointed seat.

Mauceri explains he was part of the procedural process before becoming a candidate and had never contemplated recusal, knowing the committee would ultimately have to approve any related procedures and/or related language, and the procedures were indeed modified by the committee tonight through open process. Requests all comments regarding be recorded in the minutes.

**5. REVIEW OF DONE BYLAW TABLE OF CONTENTS REQUIREMENTS DUE JUNE 06, 2011;  
DISCUSSION AND ACTION AS APPROPRIATE.**

**8:00 PM –**

(Agenda Item taken out of order)

Mauceri reports DONE has received no updated NC bylaw submissions save one adopting their new Table of Contents format. The DONE rules ask for items to be ordered in a certain way to create a cohesive Table of Contents across all neighborhood councils, citywide.

Two issues stand out for this committee:

- 1.) DONE’s format calls for items and citations the GGPNC doesn’t currently contemplate in its bylaws.
- 2.) Certain categories in the GGPNC bylaws are ordered differently from the new format.

Mauceri: Suggests we rearrange the bylaws according the DONE TOC order. Where we don’t have bylaws that fall under their categories, we should note those issues will be contemplated and resolved by public process at a later date, in effect creating “placeholders,” then decide how to go about addressing the missing passages.

De Monte: Informing the bylaw index on the most recent revision isn’t accurate.

Mauceri: Yes, the index--added for convenience--needs reordering after the last round approved

bylaw changes (somewhat extensive), but there's no sense redoing it until we rearrange the bylaws conforming to the new DONE TOC standard as this will change the document's "pagination," page numbering and the index would have to be manually reordered, anyway.

**MOTION** (DeMonte): GGPNC make our bylaws conform to the DONE Table of Contents format before changing any other language in the bylaws.

**SECOND**: De Ocampo.

**PASSED**: By consensus.

**6. TABLED GOVERNING BOARD AGENDA ITEM – COMMUNITY INTEREST REPRESENTATIVES AND THEIR RESPECTIVE COMMITTEES BEING FORMALLY BOUND TOGETHER; DISCUSSION AND ACTION AS APPROPRIATE.**

8:05 -

(Agenda Item Taken Out of Order)

Mauceri: This is old, previously adopted, committee business that should have rolled to a subsequent Governing Board meeting agenda, but didn't after being tabled at the Board level.

**MOTION**: (DeMonte): To not re-introduce to the Board until after we complete the bylaws Table of Contents reordering per DONE.

**SECOND**: De Ocampo.

**PASSED**: By consensus.

Mauceri hands over the gavel to Hyams to continue meeting as Chair.

**7. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE (EC) ELECTION FOLLOWING THE MAY 17 APPOINTMENTS; DISCUSSION AND ACTION AS APPROPRIATE.**

10:15 -

Hyams: Explains the confusion and outlines options regarding this item. Believes confusion stems from the use of the word "bi-annual." We can:

- a. Do nothing and simply fill only vacated EC seats.
- b. Recommend re-electing the entire EC, or
- c. Let the President make the call on best way to proceed.

**DISCUSSION:**

Mauceri: Thinks by "bi-annual," the bylaws intended every two years because having EC elections twice a year was clearly not the intent. "Biennial" would have been the irrefutable phrasing, but it wouldn't change the issue as there was not a date condition put on this recent change, as there were for the others changes concerning Board composition. But past precedent has been that every time the Board "turns over," as it will on May 17th, there was an entire Executive Committee election. Presently, the bylaws are clear as written; we only replace vacant EC posts.

Ostrow: Doesn't think it's as gray as is being discussed. The bylaws additionally state "in even

numbered years.” Having said that, elsewhere in the bylaws are quite specific especially regarding the transition from half appointed to all elected. The Board approved the language as written. He thinks the best way to go is just fill the newly vacated officer seats.

Hyams: Just wants to do what’s fair.

DeMonte: Attempts to recall what the practice was in the past.

Mauceri: The fact is each NC has different sets of bylaws. This has always caused trouble. He was operating under the assumption we would re-elect the entire set of officers before transitioning to the new system that would call for one last annual election of EC officers in 2012. Ron is correct regarding what is written. Sees both sides of the equation, but doesn’t know how to move this to resolution as his sense is other Board Members were operating under the same misunderstanding he was.

Ferris: Asks for clarification on seating of new members and their participation in the election of officers.

Hyams: Calls for a motion regarding to attempt to resolve this matter.

**MOTION** (Mauceri): “The Rules and Elections Committee to send a written message to the entire GGPNC Executive Committee that: "Given the nature of a discrepancy in [an interpretation of] the bylaws regarding the 'bi-annual' procedure for election of the Executive Committee, it would be in the best interest of the Board for any remaining Executive Committee Members to voluntarily lay down their office(s) in the interest of clarity and efficiency, and to maintain the previous precedent of the entire Executive Committee being reconstituted each year at the time when the Board's composition changes."

**SECOND:** Hyams.

**AMENDMENT** (De Ocampo) change “a discrepancy in...” to “an interpretation of...”

**SECOND:** DeMonte

**PASSED:** As amended.

**VOTE:** (On original motion, as amended): 3 ayes (De Ocampo, Hyams, Mauceri); 1 abstention (DeMonte).

**MOTION PASSES.**

## **8. APPROVAL OF FEBRUARY 8, 2011 MINUTES.**

**10:45 PM -**

**MOTION:** (De Ocampo) to approve.

**SECOND:** DeMonte.

## **PROCEDURES FOR SELECTION OF APPOINTED BOARD MEMBERS – MAY 2011**

The Greater Griffith Park Neighborhood Council (GGPNC) Governing Board has adopted the following procedures for the selection of District and Community Interest Representatives in May 2011, consistent with Bylaws as amended and approved by the Governing Board on February 15, 2011. These procedures include a timeline, a form of notice for candidate applications, form of application, Community Interest and District Representative Seat Descriptions, Declaration of Community Interest and Neighborhood Stake, plus candidate presentation and voting procedures.

### **I. TIME LINE:**

Week ending March 4, 2011	Post in posting places and email notice to general list.
April 22, 2011	Deadline for applications to be received at P.O. Box or by e-mail.
May 03, 2011	Circulation of candidate statements received to Governing Board; posting on website (within 3 days of receipt).
May 16, 2011	5:00 P.M. deadline for receipt of written “candidate advocacy” statements.
May 17, 2011	Governing Board Meeting, Selection of Appointed Board Members.

### **II. CANDIDATE APPLICATION PROCEDURE:**

#### **A. Choice of Position**

Prospective candidates may choose to stand for only one (1) of the nine (9) appointed Board Member positions eligible for selection at the time of application.

## **B. Candidate's Information**

Any printed or electronically posted forms, lists, ballots, etcetera of candidates standing for GGPNC Governing Board appointment shall only contain the candidate's full name, absent of any titles, honorariums, achieved degrees, etcetera.

### **III. CANDIDATE PRESENTATIONS AND VOTING PROCEDURES:**

#### **A. Neighborhood Stake and Community Interest Declaration**

Candidates shall complete a Declaration of Community Interest affirming their factual basis stake within the neighborhood's five (5) geographical boundaries, and confirming the information on his or her previously completed application.

If a candidate observes their position sought has been recorded and/or listed incorrectly, they shall immediately inform the GGPNC President, the meeting's Presiding Officer or the Secretary, where it will be compared to the candidate's original application, and if necessary the voting ballots will be adjusted accordingly before the time any appointment selection process begins.

#### **B. Optional Candidate Advocacy Statements**

Written statements by others attesting to a candidate's qualifications and worthiness for appointment no more than one 8.5" x 11" page, single spaced, in a typeface no smaller than 12 point can be submitted to the Board for consideration.

Statements must contain the name, signature, legal address, attestation of the author's factual basis stake in the neighborhood, plus current contact information for verification purposes.

Statements must be received no later than 5:00 PM, May 16th 2011, sent either by e-mail to [info@ggpnc.org](mailto:info@ggpnc.org) or mailed to: Greater Griffith Park Neighborhood Council (GGPNC), P.O. Box 27003, Los Angeles, CA 90027.

#### **C. Public Comment**

Any public comment regarding the meeting's Board Member appointment process agenda item, but not specific to a candidate's advocacy will be limited to two (2) minutes per stakeholder, and at the Presiding Officer's discretion may be reduced to one (1) minute in the interest of time if deemed to be warranted by the number of public speakers requesting audience.

#### **D. Order of Selection**

Positions will be decided first as to the District Representatives, A – E, and then as to the individual Community Interest Representatives in the order they appear in the Bylaws: (a) Education; (b) Recreation; (c) Public Safety; (d) Business.

#### **E. Use of "Tellers"**

Impartial volunteer "Tellers" shall be selected by the President and will assist in the conduct of the Board Member appointment process in accordance with the Parliamentary Authority's (Robert's Rules of Order, newly revised) description contained on pages 400-404.

## **F. Candidate Presentations**

1. The order of candidate presentations within each appointed group, i.e., District Representatives and Community Interest Representatives, and each subgroup, i.e., Districts A - E and the Education, Recreation, Business and Public Safety Interest positions will be determined by a random drawing of candidate names from a "hat" by the Order of Selection described above, and then labeled numerically with "01" being the first candidate's name pulled and so on. Candidates absent from the meeting but who have not formally withdrawn their candidacy by the time of the appointment selection process shall also have their names included in the drawing and will stand for appointment in absentia. Any candidate who cannot be present at the meeting may submit a prepared statement no longer than three (3) minutes to be read aloud by a person of his or her choosing, or in absence thereof, the Presiding Officer.
2. Any stakeholder wishing to pose a general question regarding an appointed position shall fill out a special appointment process "Speaker Card" completely and submit it before any discussion or debate of a specific appointed position begins. Special public comment during the selection of GGPNC Governing Board appointees will be limited to two (2) stakeholders with each allotted one (1) minute of speaking time. In instances where there are multiple speaker cards submitted for an appointed position, two (2) will be randomly selected by a Teller and delivered to the Presiding Officer, and those stakeholders will be called upon.
3. Each candidate will have three (3) minutes to make a presentation stating their qualifications for the position being sought, identifying the nature and any source of support in the community for their candidacy, describing what they would like to accomplish if appointed, and address any other matters relating to their candidacy.
4. The Presiding Officer shall conduct a question and answer period, where he or she shall identify any of the optional written candidate advocacy statements previously received, and the number thereof. In the interest of time, such statements will not be read aloud but shall be circulated amongst the Board with personal contact information redacted, in order to enable thoughtful review before the appointments takes place. They will also be made available for Stakeholder review at the meeting where the appointment process is agendized. All statements of advocacy circulated and made publicly available shall also be published on the GGPNC website as special addendums incorporated into the meeting minutes, which will also contain the official vote tallies as recorded by the Secretary.
5. All Board Members and the appointed candidates shall be able to participate in the question and answer period. Candidates shall have the opportunity to respond to a general question in the order previously determined for candidate presentation, unless in the case where a question is directed to a specific candidate, in which event that candidate shall be given the opportunity to respond. Board Members will be limited to one (1) general question for all candidates with the Presiding Officer ruling whether any multipart questions posed violates the spirit of the one-question condition. Candidate responses shall be limited to one (1) minute.
6. Candidates will not be permitted to address or ask each other questions in any way. However, during this question and answer period, any Board Member shall be free to seek a candidate's commentary on any issue raised by the public or by the candidates themselves with their allotted question.

## **G. Voting**

1. Voting will be conducted in accordance with the Bylaws and will proceed by written ballots with the candidates' names listed in alphabetical order by last name.
2. The Tellers will record which Board Member voted for whom during each round and will tabulate the votes to determine the outcome, but they will be instructed to deliver only the final result to the presiding officer, who will announce the result and tally of each voting round, and ultimately the name of each prevailing candidate for the appointed position.
3. During a vote, if no candidate receives a majority of the votes cast, then the name of the candidate with the fewest votes cast will be dropped from the candidate's list and a new round of voting will proceed. The process will continue until one candidate attains a majority of the votes being cast.
4. In the event of a tie between two or more candidates facing possible elimination and/or selection, there will be a special round of voting to attempt to break the tie (not including any candidate with a greater number of votes than the tied candidates) where the tied candidates will be allotted an additional minute of presentation. If, after this special vote the tie remains, the vote shall be declared deadlocked and the tie will be broken by a coin flip.

After the completion of the appointed Board Member process the Secretary shall post for public inspection, the specifics of each appointed position's voting rounds, including the total number of votes and which voting Board Member cast them as determined by the Tellers. The information shall also be incorporated into the meeting minutes so it may become part of the public record.

5. In the event any voting Board Member is a candidate for an appointed position, that Member must abstain from the voting on that position due to the inherent conflict of interest.

## **H. Closing of the Appointment Process**

At the conclusion of the final round of voting on the last appointed Board Member position in the order as described herein, the Presiding Officer shall call for a motion to close the appointed Board Member process.

## NOTICE OF GGPNC APPOINTED BOARD MEMBERS POSITIONS APPLICATION DEADLINE APRIL 22, 2011

The Greater Griffith Park Neighborhood Council (GGPNC) is seeking applications for selection to open Board Member positions. The open seats will be filled by the GGPNC Board at a board meeting on May 7, 2011 to begin at 1 pm.

In order to improve and unify the diverse communities of the Great Griffith Park area by promoting citizen participation in government at all levels and by encouraging citizens to advise city government, the positions will include five District Representative (see map) and one seat each for representatives of: (a) Education; (b) Recreation; (c) Business; (d) Public Safety. These positions to be filled are for Appointed Members whose terms are scheduled to expire in 2014. Anyone who lives, works, owns property or can declare an interest in our area may be eligible to serve.

As you may know, the GGPNC includes the areas of Franklin Hills, Griffith Park, Los Feliz and its Board will be charged with representing over 37,000 stakeholders. This is an important leadership position for the purpose of serving on an advisory body to city, state and local government officials on matters that affect our communities.

The Board will make the appointment based on determinations set forth in the GGPNC ByLaws, including as to Appointed Members the need for representation of various identified stakeholder groups in the GGPNC area in relation to the purposes of the Council, and the nominated individual's potential for assistance to the Board in representing the interests of such identified stakeholder groups and of all stakeholders within the GGPNC area.

Applicants for the position must be willing to attend GGPNC Board meetings and participate in GGPNC activities and be at least 18 years of age. 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## GGPNC Appointed Board Seat Descriptions

### **Education Representative (1 Position)**

The Education Representative serves as the representative and advocate for educational interests across all five of the GGPNC's geographical districts (A-E). ### **Recreation Representative (1 Position)**

The Recreation Representative serves as the representative and advocate for recreational interests across all five of the GGPNC's geographical districts (A-E). This person is a voting member of The Board and the GGPNC's official liaison to both publicly funded and private recreational organizations (e.g., youth and adult sports leagues, playgrounds, LAUSD "Beyond The Bell" programs). This position is tasked with ensuring the neighborhood's recreational interests are represented in all matters coming before the Council and works to promote an environment where recreational activities can flourish for community benefit and enjoyment.

### **Business Representative (1 Position)**

The Business Representative serves as the representative and advocate for business interests across all five of the GGPNC's geographical districts (A-E). This person is a voting member of The Board and is the Governing Board's official liaison to local businesses. The person holding this seat is tasked with ensuring the neighborhood's business interests are represented in all matters coming before the Council and working to promote an environment where local businesses can succeed in harmony with the surrounding community.

### **Public Safety Representative (1 Position)**

The Public Safety Representative serves as the representative and advocate for public safety interests across all five of the GGPNC's geographical districts (A-E). This person is a voting member of The Board and the GGPNC's official liaison to both publicly funded and private public safety organizations (e.g., LAPD or Neighborhood Watch). This position is tasked with promoting awareness and preparedness on public safety issues.

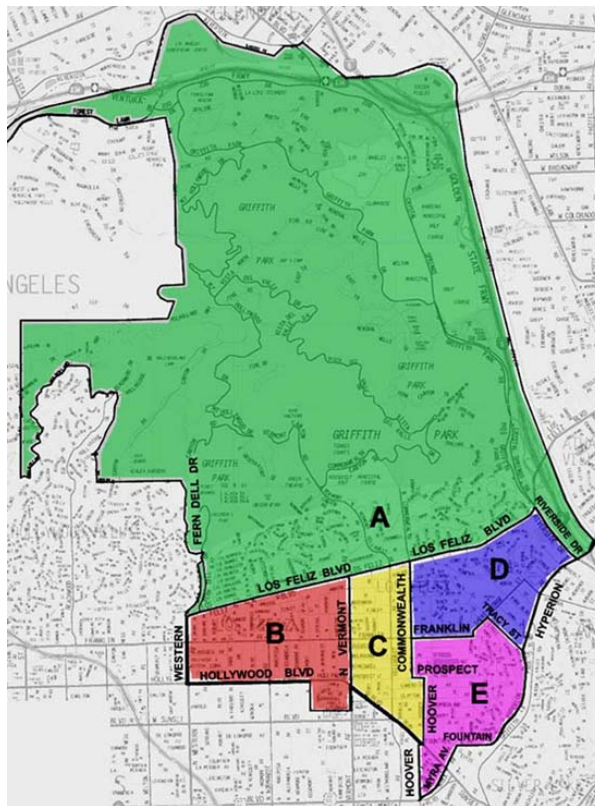
