Eastern Santa Monica Mtns & Griffith Park – Project Analyst Eric Bruins will present a brief overview of the Santa Monica Mountains Conservancy/MRCA's short and long range goals in the Eastern Santa Monica Mountains which include Griffith Park and neighboring open spaces in Northeast Los Angeles and the Hollywood Hills. Q & A follows. (25 min)

3. Griffith Park Master Plan Update – The most recent public meeting of the Griffith Park Master Plan Working Group took place a year ago to update the public on the Recreation and Parks Department's reaction to, specific requests for, and next steps for the Draft Master Plan submitted to the City by the public panel in October 2008. In July 2009, the document was returned to Working Group members with a two-week window for reaction and written reply to the Department's suggested changes. The Department has not responded to the Working Group's request for a public meeting to walk-through its proposed changes and schedule the remaining steps in this process. The Committee will focus on ways to resume the public process and complete the new Master Plan for Griffith Park. (25 min)

Comments from the public on matters not appearing on this Agenda within the Board's subject matter jurisdiction are heard during the Public Comment period, limited to 2 minutes per speaker, unless waived by the Board's presiding officer.

**PROCESS FOR RECONSIDERATION:** The Board may reconsider and amend its action on items listed here if that reconsideration takes place immediately following the original action, or at the next regular meeting. The Board, on either of these two days, shall: 1) Make a Motion for reconsideration and, if approved, 2) hear the matter and take an action. If the motion to reconsider an action is to be scheduled at the next meeting following the original action, then two items shall be placed on the agenda for that meeting: 1) A Motion for Reconsideration on the described matter and 2) a [Proposed] Action should the motion to reconsider be approved. A motion for reconsideration can only be made by a Board member who has previously voted on the prevailing side of the original action taken. If a motion for reconsideration is not made on the date the action was taken, then a Board member on the prevailing side of the action must submit a memorandum to the Secretary identifying the matter to be reconsidered and a brief description of the reason(s) for requesting reconsideration at the next regular meeting. The aforesaid shall all be in compliance with the Ralph M. Brown Act governing public entities.
