Vermont Avenue, 'Albertson's' at 2035 Hillhurst Avenue, 'Starbucks' at 1700 N. Vermont Avenue, and possibly other locations. To address the Board, the public is requested to fill out a 'Speaker Card' on any agenda item prior to the Board taking action on it. Comments from the public on agenda items will be heard only at the time the respective item is being considered. Comments from the public on matters not appearing on this Agenda within the Board's subject matter jurisdiction are heard during the Public Comment period, limited to 2 minutes per speaker, unless waived by the Board's presiding officer.

PROCESS FOR RECONSIDERATION: The Board may reconsider and amend its action on items listed here if that reconsideration takes place immediately following the original action, or at the next regular meeting. The Board, on either of these two days, shall: 1) Make a Motion for reconsideration and, if approved, 2) hear the matter and take an action. If the motion to reconsider an action is to be scheduled at the next meeting following the original action, then two items shall be placed on the agenda for that meeting: 1) A Motion for Reconsideration on the described matter and 2) a [Proposed] Action should the motion to reconsider be approved. A motion for reconsideration can only be made by a Board member who has previously voted on the prevailing side of the original action taken. If a motion for reconsideration is not made on the date the action was taken, then a Board member on the prevailing side of the action must submit a memorandum to the Secretary identifying the matter to be reconsidered and a brief description of the reason(s) for requesting reconsideration at the next regular meeting. The aforesaid shall all be in compliance with the Ralph M. Brown Act governing public entities.

Before and After School Programs

Grant Funded

After School Education & Safety (ASES)
 21st Century Community Learning Center (CCLC)

Beyond the Bell offers academic, enrichment and recreation programs before school, after school, and weekends at elementary, middle and high schools that are linked with state standards, culturally responsive pedagogy, and accountability to increase student achievement and graduation rates for all students.

Youth Services

Provides an after school safe haven for children grades 2-8. Trained staff plan and conduct the program from the end of the "core" school day until 6 p.m. each day. Serves all elementary and middle schools in LAUSD. The program is permissive where participants arrive and leave at their own discretion.

Academic Intervention Programs

Extended Learning Program (ELP)***

Offered to students experiencing difficulty in achieving grade-level standards. The program provides academic assistance in English language arts, English language development, and mathematics.

Extended Learning Academies (ELA)

Provides academic assistance in English language arts, English language development, mathematics, and/or preparation for the California High School Exit Exam (CAHSEE). Offered after school and Saturdays at year-round schools.

CAHSEE Intensive Instruction Program (CIIP)

An intensive instructional program designed to provide instruction in English language arts and mathematics that prepare students to pass the CAHSEE.

English Language Acquisition Program (ELAP)

A program designed to support English learners in grades 4-8 to achieve grade level standards and become proficient in English.

Extended School Year for Special Education (ESY)

Extended School Year is an off-track program for students with disabilities to maintain skills and behaviors as identified on their Individualized Education Plan.

Supplemental Educational Services (SES)

Free academic tutoring by state approved providers to eligible students at schools designated as Program Improvement for at least two years. Offered through the No *Child Left Behind Act* of 2001.

Ready, Set, Go!

Offers before school academic and enrichment activities developed to meet the academic and supervision needs of elementary school students beginning ninety minutes before the instructional day.



Outdoor Education

Provides hands-on programs in environmental education and human relations. The program is characterized by discovery, exploration, and observation in an environment located away from the school site. Overnight residential centers operate at two locations.

Music and Arts Partnerships

Provides the opportunity to students district-wide to participate in a variety of music and art activities. Program includes the All City Honor Band, band and drill competitions, and various art projects.

Angels Gate Academy II

A weekend program designed to enhance environmental science and the social skills of at-risk 6th and 7th grade middle school students.
